CITY COUNCIL ORDINANCE NO. 316

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4.162(8)(d) FLOOD PLAIN WATERCOURSE REGULATIONS, AND ADOPTING WATERCOURSE CODE REVISIONS TO SECTION 4.162(8)(d) CHAPTER 4 OF THE WILSONVILLE CODE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Wilsonville desires to amend the City of Wilsonville's Flood Plain Ordinance, Section 4.162(8)(d) of the Wilsonville Code, and adopts the revised watercourse standards as a new Section 4.162(8)(d) of the Wilsonville Code, to reflect watercourse regulation changes that occurred with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), for the National Flood Rate Insurance Program (NFIP), and

WHEREAS, the City Council duly considered the matter and adopting Ordinance, at its regularly scheduled meeting on July 6, 1987, and

WHEREAS, interested parties, if any, have had an opportunity to be heard on the subject.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Wilsonville ordains as follows:

Section 4.162(8)(d) Alteration of Watercourses

Provide description of the extent to which a watercourse
 will be altered or relocated as a result of proposed development.

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- Notify adjacent communities and the Federal Emergency
 Management Agency and Division of State Lands prior to any
 alteration or relocation of a watercourse, and submit evidence
 of such notification to the Federal Insurance Administration.
- Require that maintenance is provided within the altered or relocated portion of said watercourse so that the flood carrying capacity is not diminished.

The enactment of this Flood Plain Watercourse Ordinance amends the pre-existing watercourse standards of Section 4.162(8)(d).
