A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 1989 TITLED "A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING, APPROVING AND RATIFYING A TWO AND SIX TENTHS PERCENT (2.6%) BUILDING, MECHANICAL, RESIDENTIAL AND PLUMBING PERMIT FEE INFLATIONARY COST IMPACT INCREASE AS MEASURED BY THE ANNUAL CHANGE IN THE PORTLAND, SALEM CONSUMER PRICE INDEX" TO REPLACE EXHIBIT B CITY OF WILSONVILLE NON-RESIDENTIAL BUILDING PERMIT FEE.

WHEREAS, the City Council at a regular meeting on May 15, 2006 unanimously adopted Resolution No. 1989 titled, "A Resolution Confirming, Approving And Ratifying A Two And Six Tenths Percent (2.6%) Building, Mechanical, Residential And Plumbing Permit Fee Inflationary Cost Impact Increase As Measured By The Annual Change In The Portland, Salem Consumer Price Index"; and

WHEREAS, Exhibit B of the Resolution, "City of Wilsonville Non-Residential Building Permit Fees" was incomplete and did not include the following fees: Research Fee, Erosion Control Fee, Site Work/Grading Permit Fee Or Deferred Submittals Fees; and

WHEREAS, the original Exhibit B City of Wilsonville Non-Residential Building Permit Fees matrix should be replaced with the attached fee matrix.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF WILSONVILLE RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Resolution No. 1989 is amended to include the complete Non-Residential Building Permit Fees matrix as attached to this resolution as Attachment 1.
 - 2. The resolution is effective immediately upon adoption.

fire alarm, fire sprinkler, tenant improvement, residential.

Background:

At the May 15, 2006 Council meeting, Council adopted Resolution No. 1989, which increased the building, mechanical, residential and plumbing permit fees. That resolution became effective July 1, 2006. Since the adoption of the resolution, it has come to the attention of the Building Department staff that some of the Non-Residential Building Permit Fees had been inadvertently dropped from the fee matrix. These dropped fees included the Research Fee, Erosion Control Fee, Site Work/Grading Permit Fee, and the fee for Deferred Submittals.

The proposed Resolution No. 2014 will amend the Non-Residential Building Permit Fees to include the four dropped items.

Recommendation:

Adopt Resolution No. 2014 to amend Resolution No. 1989 and the Non-Residential Building Permit Fees.
