SUBJECT:

Purchase of Replacement Bookkeeping Machine

At the time we were considering the budget for the 1982-83 Fiscal Year we gave some discussion to computerization and determined that it was not feasible. In lieu of the purchase of a computer we elected to replace the existing Burroughs L5000 with an L9941. This arrangement also included a service contract rebate for the L5000, and a new 11-month Service Contract. The Service Contract also includes service to a Ledger Sheet Reader currently around, but not used heretofore.

The purchase of this machine should decrease machine time functions by more than 50%. This should make it possible for the Finance Department to maintain current records.

Recommendation - I recommend that the City accept the quotation of The Software Group, Inc., of Wilsonville, to trade-in a Burroughs L5000 Accounting Machine and Service Contract for the 1982-83 Fiscal Year, to be replaced with an L9000 (19941) series, with credit for the Service Contract on the L5000, and adjustment for one month on a new Service Contract making a net total cost of \$10,741.47. We have budgeted \$10,757.00 for this trade-in acquisition.

ADOPTION OF JACKSON ZONE CHANGE BY RESOLUTION

Under the provisions of Section 4.187 WC, a zone change recommended for approval by the Planning Commission may be adopted by City Council by Zoning Order if no objections are received. However, if objections are filed with the City Council, then a public hearing must be scheduled and the Council's final decision adopted by Resolution.

As you will recall, Council has previously considered adoption of Zone Order 82-2 for a zone change from RA-1 to PDI on the Shumate property located on the corner of 5th Street and Boones Ferry Road. In consideration of this matter, Council received objections from the applicant with regard to Planning Commission's requirement for street improvements. As a result, a public hearing was scheduled and held on July 6, 1982, at which time the Council considered additional testimony together with additional recommendations from the Planning staff, for amendments to the Planning Commission's decision.

Based on the testimony received, by motion of the Council, specific additional findings and amendments of Planning Commission Condition of Approval no. 5 were approved. Based on this motion, I have drafted the attached Resolution for formal adoption of the zone change by the City Council.
