

RESOLUTION NO. 578

A RESOLUTION APPROVING BALLOT TITLE FOR CITY CHARTER ELECTION.

WHEREAS, the Wilsonville City Council held a special City Council Meeting August 6, 1986, for the purpose of considering the repeal of the City Charter and to adopt a New City Charter; and,

WHEREAS, the Wilsonville City Council unanimously voted to place before the registered legal voters the adoption of a New City Charter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a New City Charter election will be held in the City of Wilsonville, Clackamas and Washington Counties, Oregon, at the General Election, Tuesday, November 4, 1986, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified legal voters of the City the question of approving a new City Charter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following proposal be submitted for voter approval and the Ballot Title shall be printed on the Official Ballot as follows:


CAPTION: Adopts a New City Charter

QUESTION: Shall the City of Wilsonville Adopt a New City Charter?

EXPLANATION: This measure will adopt a new City Charter. The present City Charter will be repealed. The term of Mayor will be changed from two to four years. The City's government will change from a Mayor-Council to the Council-Manager form. Councilors will be elected at large rather than by position. Eliminates floating debt limit of \$25,000. Other minor changes are also proposed. These changes reflect current City operations and State law.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Recorder shall furnish a copy of this resolution and ballot title to the elections office of Clackamas and Washington Counties.
